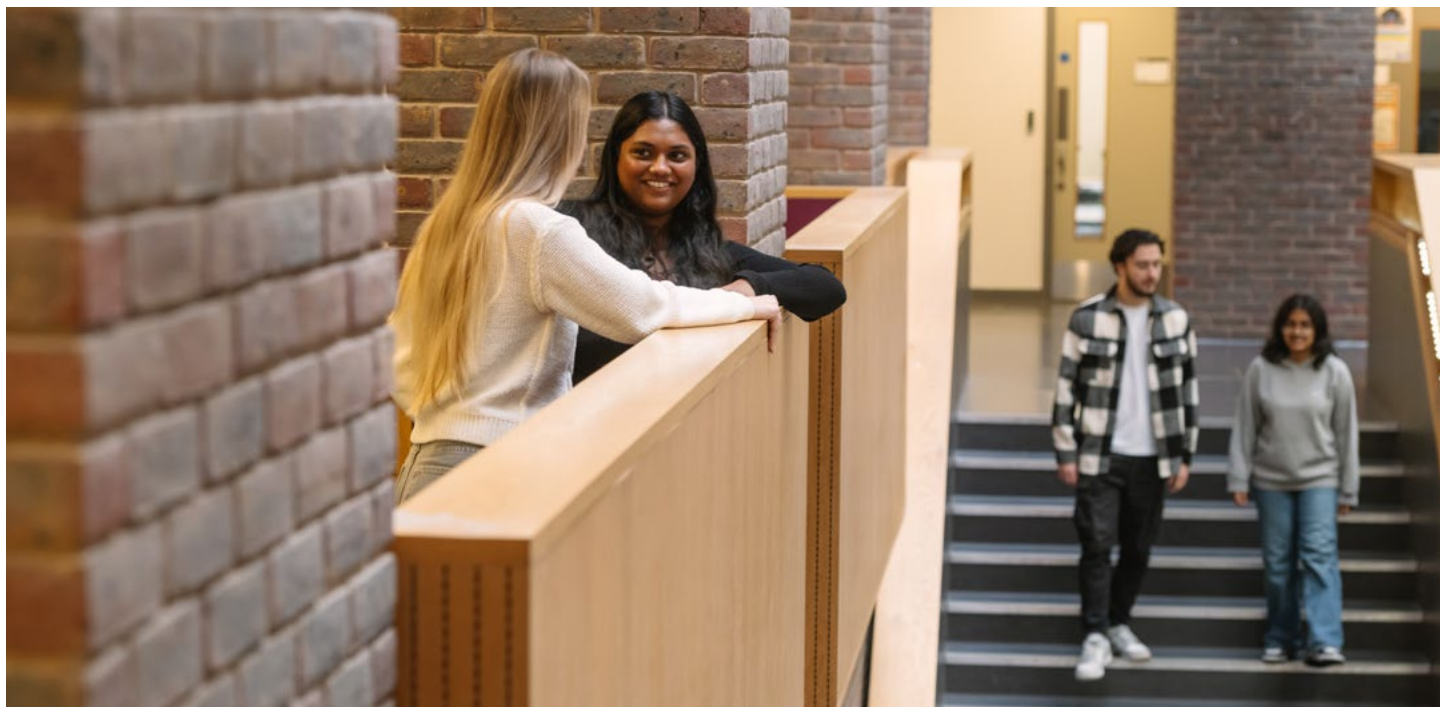

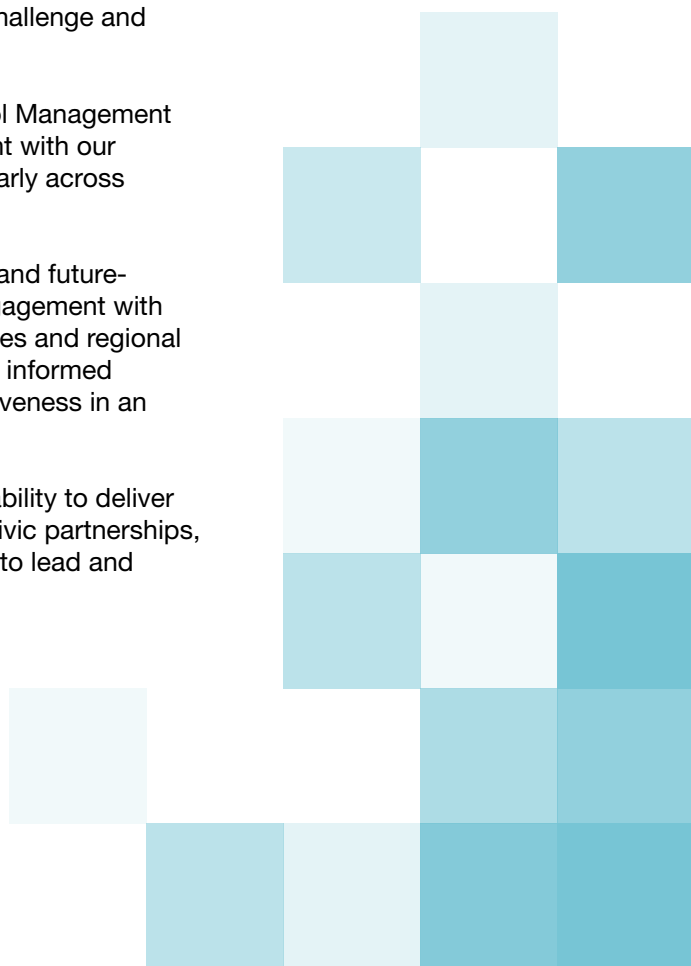

Frank Bostyn - Chair of the Advisory Board

Frank Bostyn is Emeritus Professor of Management at University of Antwerp. He holds a PhD in Economics from Ghent University, an MBA from Wharton School, and completed advanced studies at Harvard University.

He has held senior leadership roles in international higher education, including Founding Dean and Directeur Général of NEOMA Business School, Dean of EBS Paris, and Dean of the College of Business and Economics at United Arab Emirates University. He also served as Dean of Antwerp Management School and Vice-Dean at the University of Antwerp.

In addition to his academic career, he has extensive experience as a consultant and policy advisor in transition economies, with engagements in Uzbekistan, Poland, Kyrgyzstan, Romania and Ukraine. He has also advised senior government officials in Belgium and served as Deputy Chief of Staff to the Flemish Vice-Minister-President. He is currently Government Commissioner for the Flemish public broadcasting organisation VRT.

Professor Bostyn brings extensive international governance and board-level experience across Europe and the United States.



Imane Bakkar

Imane Bakkar is an experienced industry practitioner and a systemic risk expert. She is the Founder and Managing Director of LogaRisk, a strategy and risk management advisory focused on emerging risks and governance frameworks.

With 25 years of experience in the financial system, Imane held global senior risk management roles at Goldman Sachs and Morgan Stanley. She was also a senior policymaker and regulator at the Bank of England, where her work focused on market structure and financial stability risks. More recently, she worked with multilateral organisations such as UNEPFI on sustainability-related risks.

Imane started her career as a client-facing pricing and risk modelling quant, and later served a brief tenure as the lead Director on AI Risk Management at a Big 4 consultancy.



Sarah Clay

Sarah Clay is the Founder and CEO of Voices of Hope, a charity she established in 2019 to address the intersection of health, inequality and community wellbeing through creative, preventative and trauma-informed approaches. With a background as a musician and educator, she brings a distinctive perspective on the role of the arts in improving physical and mental health and strengthening communities.

Under Sarah's leadership, Voices of Hope has developed a distinctive, integrated model supporting women, children and families facing domestic abuse, poverty, trauma and social isolation. The organisation's work centres on three core areas: specialist Women's Hubs providing trauma-informed, wraparound support; children's health and wellbeing through BRITE Box and the Big Breathing Adventure, innovative programmes addressing food insecurity and family wellbeing; and creative arts for wellbeing, using music and creative arts-based interventions to support recovery and resilience.

Over the past five years, she has led significant organisational growth, with Voices of Hope now supporting thousands of individuals each week and working in close partnership with local authorities, health systems and academic institutions, including Kingston University, to deliver and evaluate impact. Sarah is particularly passionate about shaping systems that move people from crisis to long-term recovery, ensuring lived experience informs strategy, and creating environments where individuals can rebuild confidence, connection and agency as part of sustainable change.



Oriele Frank

Oriele Frank is one of the co-founders of ELEMIS. Unwavering in her passion for developing ELEMIS, Oriele worked across sales, brand, marketing, NPD and formulations. Working for over 33 years, Oriele worked in partnership with 4 different types of owners, privately owned, Steiner Leisure Group NASDAQ US, US Private Equity L Catterton and Group L'Occitane.

She became Managing Director, before studying and qualifying in a new role as Chief Product & Sustainability Officer. She was the driving force in achieving B Corp status, advocating that business can be 'a force for good', whilst still growing and remaining profitable.

She is an award-winning business leader and industry speaker in brand development, product innovation and sustainability. Oriele was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in January 2024 by Kingston University in recognition of her outstanding contribution to business and marketing. Most recently she was awarded by CEW US (Cosmetic Executive Women) the Innovators Award for her significant contribution to sustainability.

In 2026, she moved on from ELEMIS to champion new opportunities, leveraging her personal experience to advise, mentor, and inspire brands and entrepreneurs on their own brand journeys. Oriele continues her board role at CEW and the Sustainable Beauty Coalition Co-Chair role at the British Beauty Council.



Sean Gillen

Sean Gillen brings 25 years of public sector experience, most recently in economic development. This includes hands-on policy and strategy development to help support a productive business environment longer-term, alongside working closely with business on issues as diverse as high street evolution; workspace provision; the green economy; start-up, growth and innovation. With a vision to protect the planet from the harmful effects of technology, the Group, which operates under the brands Genuine Solutions and Relove Technology, is a multi-award-winning enterprise which specialises in the re-use and re-cycling of consumer tech, mobile phones and accessories.

Christian has received many accolades including being recognised for his contributions to his local community with the ‘Mayors Community’ Award and most recently an MBE for his contributions to business.

Christian’s business style mixes a strong entrepreneurial sense with a commitment to the community by supporting local services and working with community groups and charities. Professor Gary Betts

Professor Sankar Sivarajah

Professor Sankar Sivarajah is Head of Kingston Business School and Professor of Technology Management and Circular Economy at Kingston University London. He joined Kingston in September 2024, having previously served at the University of Bradford as Head of Department from 2017 and later as Dean and Head of the School of Management from 2019. He began his academic career in 2014 as a postdoctoral researcher at Brunel University London.

His teaching and research explore how digital technologies can be applied to create value for business and society. In 2025, he was recognised by Clarivate as a Highly Cited Researcher, placing him among the top 1% of researchers globally by citations in his field. He is also recognised in Stanford University's World's Top 2% Scientists list in the ICT field.

He serves as Deputy Editor of the *Journal of Enterprise Information Management* and has authored over 100 peer-reviewed publications. He has led and co-led research, innovation, and consultancy projects worth more than £3 million. These projects span 6G technology impact evaluation, AI innovation strategy, and Smart Cities, funded by leading research bodies and industry partners.

Sankar is a peer reviewer for EFMD and AACSB accreditations, a Council Member and Treasurer of the Chartered Association of Business Schools (CABS), and a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy. These roles offer valuable insight into best practice across business schools and universities in Europe, Asia and the United States.

**Dr Samar Gad**

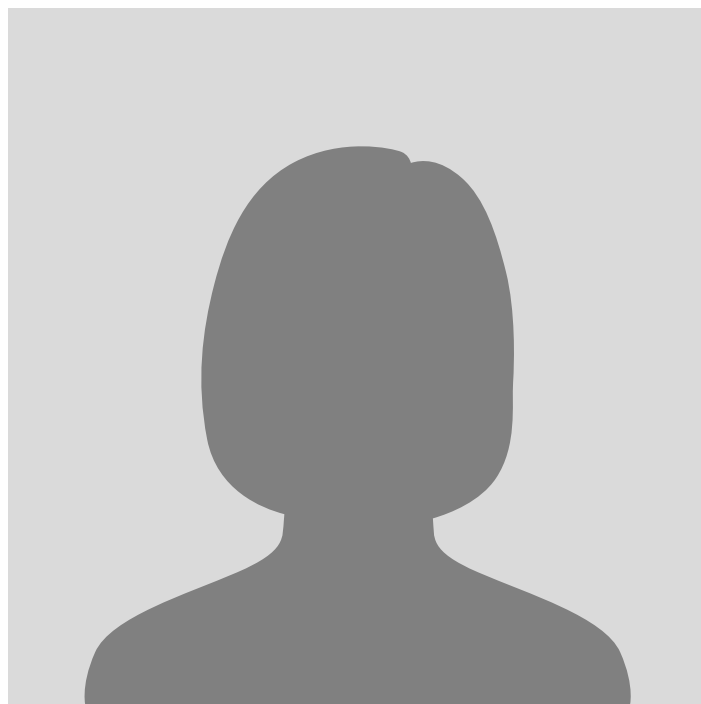
